Call to Order

Chairman DeGroot called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m.

Standards of Performance, Anti-Trust Statement and Approval of November 11, 2024, Minutes

Chairman DeGroot asked the Executive Committee members to review the Standards of Performance and the Anti-Trust Statement for the regularly scheduled fall meeting plus the November 11, 2024, Executive Committee minutes for approval.

CEO Report

Ms. Amy DeLisio, Chief Executive Officer, shared the recent and unexpected passing of Steve Miller, who was an MDC instructor for over 20 years. Ms. DeLisio shared MDC's plans for shifting from in-person assemblies to virtual field trips and shareable videos due to the State Veterinary's order banning the showing of cows and poultry. Ms. DeLisio continued by sharing federal and state regulatory updates that could affect the dairy community. She concluded by sharing the positive progress of the 2024-2025 Success Plan, stating the organization is on track and program reach numbers and engagements have increased since the November 2024 Board meeting.

March 2026 Board Location Review

Ms. Rachel Otter, Executive Assistant, shared potential Board meeting locations from Long Beach, Palm Springs and Paso Robles by summarizing overall estimated meeting costs. Ms. Otter noted the current trend in the hospitality industry is meeting room fees, in many cases, are no longer being waived, food and beverage minimums are increasing as are room rates. The Executive Committee agreed to visit Palm Springs for the March 2026 Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings.

Annual Review

Personnel/Staff Report

Ms. Josie Marcial, Human Resource Manager, provided a high-level summary on the Dairy Council of CA's Human Resources activities during 2024. Some include the Employee Handbook, Workplace Prevention Plan and the Injury Illness and Prevention Plan were updated to ensure compliance and alignment with state and federal legal requirements and reinforce workplace safety.

2024 Contracts, CEO's 2024 Expense Account and 2024 Office Lease
Ms. Kendall House, Operations Director, shared contract status as five completed and
18 ongoing from the calendar year 2024. Ms. House shared a comparative timeline from
2021 to 2024 of Ms. DeLisio's travel expenses, noting after COVID, her attendance at
conferences and events increased, as have travel costs, but are staying within or below
budgeted amounts. Ms. House concluded with the Dairy Council of CA's office lease
monthly costs decreased after moving to the new location in December 2024, showing
significant cost savings.

Financial Reports

Mr. Matt Delgado, Operations Officer, reported the FY 2024-2025 Financial Report through September 30, 2024, and the Cash Investments through December 31, 2024. The Dairy Council of CA revenues are 97.5% and expenses are 97.1% of the budget for the first half of the fiscal year. Current reserves are at 5.6 months and investments remain stable.

Mr. Delgado shared potential budget projections for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. Afterwards, the Executive Committee decided to revisit the discussion at the March Executive Committee meeting. No motion was made.
